World Autism Awareness Day

Saturday, April 2 is World Autism Awareness Day and we would like to take this opportunity to share Variety BC's new initiative ... funding private Autism Assessments.

Quick Facts About Autism

- 1 in 36 boys in BC are diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- Wait lists through the public system are currently between 2–3 years
- The average cost of a private Autism Assessment is \$3,000
- Government funding drops from \$22,000 to \$6,000 after a child enters school

We know that early intervention is so crucial for kids with Autism so the sooner they can receive a diagnosis, the sooner they can access annual government funding to provide them with support and therapies to help them achieve the best outcomes.
