- Hospital grants to alleviate financial pressures on families seeking emergency care so they can focus on their child's recovery

Choose Your Variety Pillar



Variety – the Children's Charity of BC provides direct assistance to kids through a wide spectrum of individual grants.

When your school supports Variety BC, you are making a direct impact in the life of a child living right in your home community. Variety supports kids in 5 key funding areas, and we would be happy to share with you a story of a kid who's been helped because of your school's desire to pitch in and give back.

If there is a particular funding area you are most interested in, please do let us know so when it's time to report back, we can do so in a way that's most meaningful to you! Five Areas Where Variety Steps In

Private Assessments



Since opening funding for private autism assessments and psychoeducational assessments in 2021, Variety has enabled over 1,300 children to receive assessments which has unlocked critical funding for essential therapies and other resources. Variety is the only organization stepping in and providing funding to access the private system so that kids don't have to wait the 2-3 years for an assessment through the public system. Variety does not receive government funding to approve these grants and relies on the generosity of our province to help these families. The demand for autism and psychoeducational assessments in our province continues to rise and Variety's waitlist continues to grow at

an overwhelming rate. With the long list of applications currently waiting to be reviewed, Variety has temporarily closed intake for private assessments while we evaluate a manageable way forward. Funding for private assessments is currently our area of greatest need.

When your school champions the private assessments pillar, you're helping kids like Sep, a 3-year-old from Prince Rupert who up until the age of 1 was non-verbal. Sep didn't respond to his name and didn't make any eye contact which concerned his parents. Variety was able to fund Sep with a private autism assessment. Once the diagnosis was confirmed, Sep's family was able to gain access to \$22,000 per year in government funding to get Sep the professional help he needed, and his therapies began almost immediately. He can now communicate his wants and needs by saying 'yes' or 'no,' has learned a total of ten words, and is making eye contact more frequently.

Adaptive & Mobility Equipment



Variety has always been committed to ensuring kids and their families have the freedom to go outside, be mobile and participate actively in their communities by funding essential medical supplies and mobility equipment such as hearing aids, manual and power wheelchairs, adaptive trikes and custom orthotics to name a few.

When your school champions the adaptive & mobility equipment pillar, you're helping kids like Lucy, a 6-year-old girl from Quesnel who has been diagnosed with Athetoid Cerebral Palsy. Lucy's arms and legs are constantly and uncontrollably flailing which causes her to fall over when

she uses her walker. Lucy's condition requires her to be held still and upright so she can be tube fed. This labour intensive process is done three times a day and consumes four hours of her mother's time. Variety provided Lucy with a specialized activity chair which keeps her in position when being fed. Plus, the stability makes it easier for her to move around more freely on her own.

Specialized Therapies



Variety funds a wide range of therapies that help kids develop broad cognitive, motor and social skills, learn to communicate (speech & language therapy), rebuild or strengthen muscles (physiotherapy), and learn how to master everyday tasks (occupational therapy). Sometimes, kids need an "out of the box" approach which is why Variety recently began funding equine therapy and music therapy as well!

When your school champions the specialized therapies pillar, you're helping kids like Daemon from Kamloops who was diagnosed with a speech sound disorder at the age of 2. He has a hard time pronouncing

the sounds of certain letters and gets frustrated when people can't understand what he is saying. He will often us his mom, Rebecca as a "translator" as she's usually the only one who can make out what he's saying. It's been heartbreaking for Rebecca to see her shy & nervous 6-year-old son struggling. That's when Variety stepped in and provided Daemon with speech & language therapy. Since that time, Rebecca has confirmed there's been significant improvement in both Daemon's communication and his self-confidence.

Mental Wellness



Kids struggling in their day-to-day lives may be experiencing signs of anxiety, depression or low self-esteem. There has been a significant rise in the number of kids facing mental health challenges since the global pandemic. Variety is here to support kids with clinical counselling to offer them support and help find healthy coping mechanisms.

When your school champions the mental wellness pillar, you're helping kids like 12-year-old Isaac from Victoria. At the age of 6, it was discovered that Isaac was blind in one eye and visually impaired in the other. He has been experiencing severe trauma ever since becoming a target for a school bully who was physically attacking him and because of his vision

impairment, Isaac was unable to tell when the bully was coming or to prepare himself for the assault. It was in Grade 2 when Isaac was diagnosed with ADHD and dyslexia which can present if a person is experiencing trauma. Variety has been providing the courageous kid with counselling and music therapy to assist in his recovery.

Tuition & Tutoring



Variety offers educational support for kids by funding one-on-one tutoring and tuition bursaries to attend a specialized school. Learning in an environment where children can succeed carries over into their social, emotional and physical health.

When your school champions the tuition & tutoring pillar, you're helping kids like 14-year-old Alex from Burnaby who was adopted to a very loving family. Because of their birth mother's struggles with addiction, Alex was diagnosed with a myriad of conditions which included fetal alcohol spectrum disorder, ADHD, cerebral palsy and epilepsy. At the start of high

school, Alex determined that they were not their assigned gender and school became increasingly challenging as they became socially ostracized. Alex's adoptive parents took quick action and found a private school where Alex also received LGBTQ+ support. With tuition support from Variety, Alex is now able to learn at their own pace and has found what every child needs ... belonging and acceptance.

Elementary Schools (K-7)

Are you PAC-led or an educator working mostly with students in Grades K-6/7? This is the community for you!



Middle-Secondary Schools (7-12)

Are you an educator leading an extracurricular club with students in Grades 7-12 or a high school student interested in starting a club with the goal of making a difference? Here's where you want to be!



Why do we ask?

So you can see what some of the top fundraising schools are doing, share your success and be inspired by age-appropriate fundraising ideas ... all while creating a little friendly competition with other schools in your district and around the province.

How it Works

1. **Register:** If this is your first time or your school has not set up its own fundraising page yet, click "Register" on the top right of the page to get started!





- 2. **Customize Your Page:** Check out the Participant Centre to update information on your school's page, add photos and videos and set up a fundraising thermometer to track your progress!
- 3. **Find Your School**: Use our search box to type in your school's name and find your page or simply share your custom URL (www address) with your school community to take them straight to your page!
- 4. **Join Your School:** Students can join the team and start collecting donations online by clicking the "Join Your School" button on your school page. After completing a short sign-up process, students will have their very own personal page where they can share with family & friends the reason they're fundraising and where their loved ones can donate to support them. Each student's contributions add up on your school page for one collective total to reach your goal!
- 5. **Thank Your Supporters:** Don't forget to thank your community for helping your cause. There are customizable email templates ready for you to send in your Participant Centre no need to copy and paste. You can send your appreciation right from here!
- 6. **Donate to Variety BC:** Your online donations come straight to Variety BC and every supporter is emailed a tax receipt directly. Fundraising online and collecting donations at school too? No problem. Mail us a school cheque for your offline proceeds and we'll make sure it's added to your school page and is reflected in your online totals!

How will you decide who is baking for your fundraiser? Is this activity accessible to all of the students at your school?
Heartly's Hint: Put a twist on your Bake Sale with a cupcake decorating party and help create an inclusive school community. Ask classrooms to come up with their own themes and decorate cupcakes together as a team. You can showcase each classroom's cupcakes and have a friendly competition to see who sells the most!

Plan Your Bake Sale

You're ready to start planning your event. With two tablespoons of teamwork and a dash of creativity, your Bake Sale will be a piece of cake – literally!



Here are a few fun themes to inspire you:



Healthy Bake Sale

- Host a healthy Bake Sale set up like a Farmer's Market where each booth features a different fruit or vegetable
- Display nutrition fact cards so your customers can learn more about forming healthy eating habits
- Sell reusable shopping bags with your schools' logo to encourage ecofriendly shopping



Breakfast Bar

- Host a pancake breakfast and sell jarred mixes for people to flip their own jacks with assorted toppings and syrups
- Set up a "Grab & Go" table where your customers can pick up coffee, muffins & breakfast bars on the run
- Throw a Donut Carnival with "by donation" games such as donut stacking & eating donuts off a string



School Recipe Book

- Create a recipe book to feature all of your bakers and sell it to raise even more funds

- Is there a kitchen or a teacher's room you can have access to if needed?
- Where will you get the tables, tablecloths, chairs and other equipment you need?
- What kind of information can Variety provide you with to share with your customers about how they are helping?
- Have you printed out the Variety ingredients & Price Cards to hand out to all of your bakers?
- Does anyone have a friend or family member who can get involved to help bake, take photos or spread the word?
- Are there any big events coming up at your school where there will be lots of people around to buy your baked goods?

Roadblocks & Solutions

If you can anticipate potential problems now, you can overcome them later with a backup plan!

- Could your event get cancelled (global pandemic or snow day)?
- What will you do if there aren't enough bakers who volunteer?
- What will you do with any baked goods that don't sell (buy one/get one free sale or auction off to "cake" a teacher)?

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Get Started

Ready to make a change? Start by letting everyone know why your school is hosting a Coin Drive so your fundraiser makes perfect "cents"!

Why are you planning a Coin Drive at your school? What impact will this make in the lives of BC's kids?
What does it mean to make the world a more inclusive and accessible place? How can your ideas impact someone's life? Will it make a difference in your life?

(If every class collects 100 quarters, how many classrooms need to participate to reach your goal?)

Penny for your thoughts? How will you make sure your Coin Drive is inclusive and accessible?



Can everyone make a difference no matter how much they donate? What does inclusion mean to you?
Heartly's Hint: Put a twist on your classroom competition with a "reverse Coin Drive" and offer prizes for the classroom who gets the most points and for the classroom with the most money raised. Students who donate smaller coins can help their class win more points (nickles = 5 points, dimes = 10 points, quarters = 25 points) and students who donate larger coins (like a loonie or toonie) can help their class raise the most money. It's a win-win literally!
Will you accept only coins or are there other ways to help raise funds? Is this activity accessible to all of the students, parents & teachers at your school?
Heartly's Hint: Variety Schools can help you set up your school's very own online fundraising page so that students, teachers, friends & family from far and wide who can't make it to your school to donate can still participate in your Coin Drive! Plus this is a great way to include those who may not have time to go to a bank to ask for coins!
Does everyone use the same type of money? What do your friends & family use when they visit other countries around the world? What does diversity look like at your school?

Heartly's Hint: Invite your classmates to bring coins from other countries to showcase at your school! How many different currencies make up your school community? What can you buy with just one coin from different countries?

Plan Your Coin Drive

Nice work! It's time to start planning your Coin Drive. With some careful calculations and a balance of hard work and fun, your fundraiser is sure to prosper.



Here are a few fun themes to inspire you:



Coin Wars

- Give coins a points value (nickels = 5 points, dimes = 10 points, quarters = 25 points, loonies = 1 point & toonies = 2 points and award a prize to the classroom with the most points
- Make large coins count for negative points (loonies = minus 10 points & toonies = minus 20 points) and allow students to add them to other classrooms' jars to drum up some extra competition
- Award the classroom with the most dollars raised as a result of having their points taken away by competitors a prize as well!



Class Colours

- Each class chooses a colour to represent them and cuts that coloured paper into strips
- For every dollar each class raises, they add a paper link to the chain in their chosen colour
- Watch your hallways burst to life with all the colours of the rainbow and see which classroom is taking the lead!



Event by Donation

- Invite friends & family to attend a sporting event or school concert already being planned at your school
- Encourage attendees to enter by donation (anything helps) at the door
- Sell 50/50 tickets or popcorn at the event by donation – your guests can choose how much they give!


